WHAT TO BRING AND WHAT TO FORGET Southwest Bible Camp 2018 (Please clip and keep this portion for your reference)

Each staff member at Southwest Bible Camp must bring a good attitude. This means a desire to learn what the Bible has for you; a willingness to subject yourself to the leadership of the camp: the director, the speaker, and the counselors; a readiness to participate in the activities of the group; and an attitude of respect for members of the opposite sex.

WHAT TO FORGET

A childish attitude of rebellion against authority and an attitude of wanting to "do your own thing." Please do not bring offensive clothing and potentially harmful or distractive articles, such as : halter tops, short shorts, tight shorts, spandex, short skirts, immodest swim wear, cut-off T-shirts (mid-drifts), see-through blouses or shirts, ostentatious jewelry, heavy makeup, radios, boom boxes, MP3 Players, CD players, tobacco products, controlled substances (except by medical prescription), weapons (including knives), fireworks, pets, playing cards, motorcycles, valuables, video players. Cell phones permitted but restricted.

IF YOU FEEL

If you feel that these requests are too restrictive, then we must ask you not to come to Southwest Bible Camp. You will not benefit yourself and you will prevent others from enjoying their week of camp. A persistent attitude of defiance or willful disregard of the rules shall be grounds for sending you home before camp is over at your own expense. . The leadership of Southwest Bible Camp will make decisions relating to the interpretation of this dress code. All participants are to abide by the dress and behavior code.

CAMP RULES FOR SAFETY AND WELL-BEING

1. Camp participants must remain on camp property. Town is absolutely OFF-LIMITS!
2. Your counselor must know where you are at ALL TIMES.
3. Campers will attend all meetings. No exceptions. Report for meetings on time.
4. Dorms are off limits to members of the opposite sex.
5. Wear shoes (not flip-flops or sandals) at all times while outside. Flip-flops may be worn to and from the pool and allowed for non-athletic events.
6. See the camp nurse for any medical problem.
7. Regular sick call is before breakfast and before supper. Emergency help available anytime.
8. First talk over any problems with your counselor.
9. Bring any grievances you think are not resolved to the camp director.
10. The camp speaker is available at all times for discussion and help.
11. The camp kitchen is off-limits to campers and pre-campers (State Law).
12. Do not leave the group. The river can be dangerous, and so can things that live along its banks.
13. While swimming and hiking, the buddy system will be strictly observed. Swimming without official supervision is strictly prohibited.
14. No motorized vehicles shall be operated by campers and junior staff while camp is in session, except for official camp business expressly authorized by the camp director. Ignition keys must be surrendered to the camp director for safekeeping. They will be returned to you when you go home.
15. No fireworks (not even on the fourth of July). Even when not in use, fireworks pose a fire and safety hazard. Any fireworks or other prohibited articles in your possession shall be surrendered to the camp director for safekeeping. They will be returned to you when you go home.
16. Junior staff members are generally bound by the same rules as campers (e.g.: prompt attendance at all meetings), except where specific tasks assigned.
17. Vehicle owners: cassette players, DVD, or CD players shall not be operated while the vehicle is on camp property. Cell phones are permitted but may be restricted for use.
